Indonesia Cotton and Products Update November 2018

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Report Highlights:

Driven by domestic economic growth, competitive cotton prices, and continued strong textile export demand, 2018/19 cotton imports are forecast to reach 3.55 million bales. U.S. continues to be the dominant supplier, with just over 40 percent market share.

Situation and Outlook

Executive Summary

Cotton use increased in 2017/18 due to price-competitiveness vis-a-vis polyester, cotton mill expansion, and higher textile export demand. Cotton imports for 2017/18 are estimated to have been 3.498 million bales, compared to 3.391 million bales in 2016/17. Driven by domestic economic growth, competitive cotton prices, and continued strong textile export demand, 2018/19 cotton imports are forecast to reach 3.55 million bales.

Textile product export volume increased from 2.21 million tons in 2016 to 2.23 million tons in 2017, while value increased from \$11.8 billion to \$12.5 billion during the same period. The United States (32.34 percent), European Union (14.97 percent), and Japan (10.08 percent) are the leading destinations for Indonesia's textile exports. Domestic demand for locally made textiles continues to decline due to competition from low cost imports. The rupiah continued to weaken during 2018, surpassing Rp 15,000/\$ in October.

Production

Domestic cotton production is insignificant and continues to decline.


Consumption

Cotton use is forecast to continue growing in 2018/19, driven both by textile exports and election-year demand for campaign clothes. In addition, higher prices for imported synthetic fibers relative to local cotton yarn will provide opportunities to increase cotton consumption.

Furthermore, a Minister of Trade led July 2018 delegation to the United States resulted in concrete sales and a stronger commitment to increase U.S. purchases. Finally, the local industry reports that U.S.-China trade tensions has created opportunities for Indonesia's textile exports to the United States, further underpinning demand for U.S. cotton.

While the weakening rupiah relative to the U.S. dollar has driving up imported raw material costs, the currency movement has also helped exports, leading textile companies to focus even more on exports. A major buyer of cotton reports increasing exports to 60 percent of total production from 54 percent. Efforts to increase exports are also supported by several recently bilateral trade agreements, e.g. with Japan (IJ-EPA, Indonesia – Japan Economic Partnership Agreement) and China (AC-FTA, ASEAN – China Free Trade Agreement). Total textile exports are forecast to increase about 9 percent in 2018. The industry also has big expectations for the Indonesian – European Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (IEU-CEPA), which is supposed to be concluded in 2019.

Approximately 300 spinners are operational, with 2.2 million tons of yarn production capacity per year. Spinning mills are running at about 80 percent capacity.

Trade

In line with growth in textile exports, 2018/19 cotton imports are forecast to increase to 3,550 million bales. In 2017/18, the United States was the leading cotton supplier with 42.9 percent market share, followed by Brazil (25.5 percent), and India (7.8 percent)

Stocks

Local spinners maintain inventories equaling about 2 months of needs.

Marketing

Cotton Council International (CCI) continues to educate the local industry on the advantages of using U.S. cotton. On September 12, 2018, CCI held World Cotton Day in Jakarta. The US Ambassador officially opened the event, and approximately 200 participants attended. Besides presenting new cotton innovations and technology, the event also promoted the use of the "Cotton USA" logo. Many local spinners already use the logo, and it has proven to be a strong branding tactic.

On October 25, 2018, in conjunction with Jakarta Fashion Week, CCI held a USA Cotton seminar. Two representatives from prominent integrated textile manufacturers delivered presentations on the benefits of using US cotton and the "Cotton USA" logo. Around 50 participants ranging from fashion designers, fabric manufacturers, and consumers attended the event. More spinners are expected to join "Cotton USA" programs and use more U.S. cotton as a result of CCI's marketing endeavors.
