### Grain and Feed Update\_ Feed Ingredient Import Requirement

**Report Highlights:**

Recently the Indonesian Ministry of Agriculture's Directorate General for Livestock and Animal Health Services began to more stringently enforce a 2002 requirement for the issuance of import permits for non-premixed feed ingredients; especially from China, India, and Myanmar due to concerns over foot and mouth disease.

**General Information:**

Following a reported outbreak of foot and mouth disease (FMD) in Myanmar, China, and India, the Indonesian Ministry of Agriculture's Directorate General of Livestock and Animal Health (DGLAHS) Office has indicated that it will more vigorously enforce of the DGLAHS Decree No. 63/2002. The enforcement of this decree will impact the issuance of non-premixed feed ingredient import permits, to include soybean meal, corn, corn gluten meal, dried distillers grains, and other plant based livestock feed ingredients from China, India and Myanmar. The stated objective of this action is to prevent the introduction of FMD to Indonesia. The regulation stipulates that importers of feed ingredients from the aforementioned countries and other countries with endemic FMD must submit a copy of fumigation certificate with import permit applications. Due to the United States' status of being free from FMD, imports of feed ingredients from the United States are exempted from this requirement. The complete requirement is as follows:

**Requirements to apply for non premix feed ingredients import permits.**

The application for non-premixed feed ingredient import permits can be submitted by:

- a. Feed producers who process feed ingredients and have a valid Permanent Business License (*Izin Usaha Tetap = IUT*) or Principal License issued by the authorized agency; and
- b. Trading Companies who receive orders from feed producers or processors.

**Documents that must be completed for the application process:**

1. The following information is required in the application letter:
  - a. Type and volume of feed ingredients that will be imported.
  - b. Country of origin.
  - c. Loading port.
  - d. Unloading/entry port.
  - e. Name and address of the trading company.
  - f. Tax Payer Identification Number (*Nomor Pokok Wajib Pajak = NPWP*)
  
1. The application letter must be completed with:
  - a. A copy of Contract Letter or L/C or Invoice.
  - b. A copy of technical specification of the imported feed ingredients.
  - c. A copy of Phytosanitary Certificate of the imported feed ingredients for country with endemic status of Foot and Mouth Disease (*Penyakit Mulut dan Kuku = PMK*).
  - d. A copy of fumigation treatment notification for feed grains and feed seeds originated from country with endemic status of Foot and Mouth Disease.
  - e. A copy of Certificate of Origin.

- f. A copy of product information (brochure) for newly introduced feed ingredients.
- g. List of feed ingredients order from feed producer for application that will be submitted by a Trading Company.
- h. A copy of SIUP, API/APIT, and NPWP for a company that submits the application for the first time.

#### Technical Requirements:

- a. Imported feed ingredients must come from a country free of transmittable animal diseases as listed on the OIE's List A and free of Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE) as well as free from plant pests.
- b. Animal based and plant based feed ingredients originated from a country with a transmittable animal diseases endemic particularly of those diseases listed in OIE's List A and List B can be considered to be accepted or rejected based on the regulations currently in effect.
- c. Imported feed ingredients must meet the feed ingredients quality standard as stated in the Indonesian National Standard (*Standar Nasional Indonesia = SNI*) and the decisions of the DGLSAH, Indonesian Ministry of Agriculture. The imported feed ingredients must not be contaminated by substances harmful for human and animal health such as dioxin, heavy metal, chemical residues, hormones, antibiotics, aflatoxin, etc.
- d. Feed producers applying for the import permits must report the installed capacity and running capacity of their facility on the current year.

#### Non-Technical Requirements:

- a. Complete documents including statement of the use of the imported feed ingredients, volume of the feed ingredients that will be imported, and installed production capacity.
- b. Monthly reports of feed ingredients import realization and distribution.
- c. Request letter to import feed ingredients addressed to the Director General for Livestock and Animal Health Services, Ministry of Agriculture.

#### Procedure to Obtain the Feed Ingredients Import Permit:

1. The importer should submit a request letter to obtain the import permit (*Permohonan Surat Keterangan Bahan Baku Pakan Impor*) addressed to the Director General for Livestock and Animal Health, Indonesian Ministry of Agriculture.
2. The DGLSAH will issue an import permit for one type of feed ingredient which will be valid for three months started from the issuance date of the import permit.
3. If the import permit is not executed after three months of the issuance date, no extension can be obtained and the importer should submit another request to obtain a separate import permit.
