# **Quinoa Overview**

## **Report Highlights:**

Quinoa production in Peru is expected to reach 46,500MT in CY 2013. Quinoa exports totaled 11,924 MT (\$34.3 million) in 2012 and is expected to continue increasing in the upcoming years.

### **General Information:**

### Overview

Quinoa (*Chenopodium quinoa*) production in Peru is expected to reach 46,500MT in CY 2013. Most of the Peruvian quinoa is produced in the southern highlands of the country, particularly in the Puno region where 75 percent of the 38,500 hectares of harvested area in Peru is located. Quinoa is produced by small farmers with limited technical assistance. Quinoa yields have remained at 1.5 MT/Ha for many years.

Though not a major crop in terms of harvested area, quinoa has become an important Peruvian export due to increasing demand from the world for this high protein grain. Quinoa is particularly important since its revenue benefits one of Peru's poorest regions.

Demand from developed countries has doubled the price of quinoa in the last five years. The average export price in 2007 was \$1,308 per MT to \$2,882 per MT in 2012. Prices of colored quinoas are even higher, red quinoa for example sales as high as \$4,500 per MT.

Peruvian quinoa exports, in terms of value, have increased almost five times between 2007 and 2012. Demands for quinoa will most likely increase even faster since the United Nation's Food and Agriculture Organization declared 2013 as the International Year of Quinoa.

The United States is the main market for Peruvian quinoa, accounting for 62 percent of total Peruvian exports (in terms of value) in 2012.
